



SFI-FUNDED PhD SCHOLARSHIP

A 4-year PhD scholarship is available at the ChemLight group (www.nuigalway.ie/chemlight), School of Chemistry, in NUI Galway in the area of metallocarborane chemistry, focusing on the development of new biocompatible materials for targeted breast cancer research. This multidisciplinary project lies between chemistry, biochemistry, nanomaterials and oncology and the candidate will work in close collaboration with groups within NUI Galway and abroad. The research programme will encourage networking and strong clinical and industry collaborations. The successful candidate will be provided with training and development opportunities designed to support his/her personal career development plans.

The scholarship, funded by CURAM, covers EU tuition fees, includes an annual salary of €18500 and an annual budget allocated for consumables, training and travel. Candidates will be expected to hold a Master's degree in Chemistry and experience in organometallic chemistry, in particular metallocarborane synthesis, is highly desirable. The starting date of the scholarship is September 1st 2018.
